
Turns policy into action

















Summary cancer portfolio Horizon 2020 (3)




Distribution by Member States & Associated States





Joint governance established

- Dialogue with Member States: a <u>sub-group on cancer under the Steering Group on Health</u> <u>Promotion, Disease Prevention and Management of Non-Communicable Diseases (SGPP)</u> follows jointly the implementation of the Europe's Beating Cancer Plan and the Cancer Mission.
- **Dialogue with stakeholders:** a <u>Stakeholder Contact Group</u> under the EU Health Policy Platform as a basis for discussion and exchange.
- **EU Implementation Group:** a dedicated group gathering different Commission services to ensure that actions, policies and findings are aligned across the relevant Commission departments.






Governance – linking EU and Member States initiatives

Network of national Cancer Mission Hubs To foster dialogue on cancer prevention and control

Main activities:

- Awareness raising and coordination of Mission's activities among relevant actors in national, regional or local R&I and health systems;
- Facilitate integration of Mission activities at national, regional, and local levels;
- Facilitate engagement of actors and stakeholders beyond R&I and health systems to cover all areas relevant for cancer control, e.g. cross-policy dialogues;
- Support citizen engagement activities.



Our demography, our economy


