About the ENPI CBC Med Programme

Focus on 2007-2013 period

- **13 countries:** Cyprus, Egypt, Greece, France, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Lebanon, Malta, Palestine, Portugal, Spain, Tunisia
- Budget: **€200 million**
- Key principles: **partnership, co-ownership, common benefits**
- Management of the Programme entrusted to the **Autonomous Region of Sardinia (Italy)**, supported by 2 Branch offices in Aqaba (Jordan) and Valencia (Spain)



About the ENPI CBC Med Programme

Overview of results

- 3 calls for proposals: 1995 grant applications received
- 95 funded projects - 727 organizations involved
- Total value of funded projects: €204 million

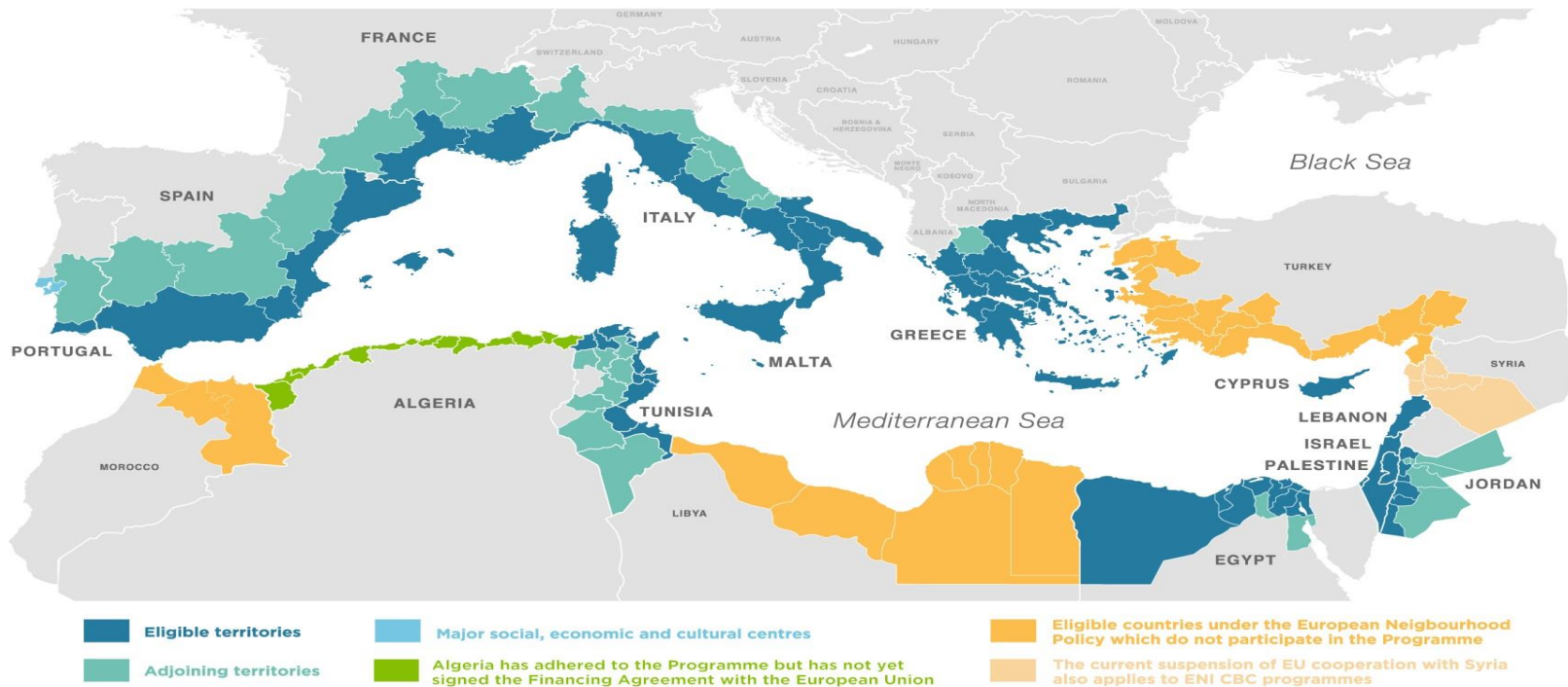

Interreg NEXTMED: tentative calendar

- **National consultations** on the Policy Objectives based on the draft territorial analysis: ongoing **ending 27th of October**
- **Task Force** decision on the Programme objectives: **first Week of December 2020**
- National consultations on specific objectives and actions: **end of 2020 - beginning 2021**
- Adoption of the regulatory framework: **beginning 2021**
- Submission of the Programme document to the European Commission: **summer 2021**
